Club Regulations for Substitutes

The Club's Rules & Regulations have recently been put into question and that has led to an amendment on some clauses within the section dealing with the permissible number of substitutes in a unit. The main change within those clauses now restricts the number of substitutes in a three week pairs event to one.

The overriding clause allowing that number to be varied still stands. Should circumstances warrant, the Tournament Director and the director of the session may accept an additional substitute.

Slow play

I have heard that there has been some improvement in the rate of play in most sessions which is very encouraging. There will always be occasions when a table has fallen too far behind the clock to allow the set of boards to be completed. If this should happen at your table, please accept the situation gracefully after all, an average for the unplayed board is not a heavy penalty.

A special bouquet goes to the pair who recently acknowledged that they were at fault for the slow play and volunteered to take an average minus. And a bouquet also goes for their opponents who told the Director that such a penalty was not necessary. Good spirit shown by all involved.

Because South is the player who can see the clock most easily, the Committee has recommended that South should draw attention to time problems at the table. For example, if the table has only played one board in a set of three and there are just ten minutes left for the remaining two boards, it is appropriate for South to bring this to the attention of the other players. Please do not accuse South of being bossy or of exerting undue pressure if this happens at your table, South is simply doing what has been requested, to keep the game moving.

Hand records

Some people seem worried about a shortage of hand records. If copies have run out, there will usually be someone around who can run off extra photocopies. If not, the hand records will appear almost instantly on the Club's website and be there waiting for you when you get home.
