REPORT OF THE TEACHING SUB-COMMITTEE - MAY 2015

CURRENT "STATE OF PLAY"

Beginner's Lessons

These started in February with an enrolment of 39. Last Wednesday there were 26 attendees. Wayne reported that the feedback he is getting is that too much is being covered too quickly.

Supervised Play

Sessions have continued on both Wednesday night and Thursday. Numbers have dwindled on Wednesday night from 4 or 5 tables to 2 or 3 since the new lessons started. Thursday is continuing with two tables and the participants have resisted our suggestions that we abandon it.

Intermediate Lessons

There has been an excellent response to this with over 35 attending the sessions. Feedback has been good and the retention rate has been very high.

SUB - COMMITTEE

A meeting was held early in the month to consider the submission made by the Canberra Bridge Club who has received a grant from the ABF to develop a program to try and retain more novice and restricted players in the club. As a preliminary to this I tried to get some idea of what has happened with those who have participated in the lessons since Wayne took over in 2011. Lessons have been run twice yearly since then with a little over 200 students starting the courses. I do not have figures on how many actually finished each set of lessons. Of these 200, about 30% appear to be still playing bridge outside the home. About 25% are playing at Newcastle mostly on a Tuesday or a Wednesday night and I could identify 14 who have "ventured into the mainstream". I would like to stress this was not a rigorous survey.

At our meeting we examined the CBC submission but came to the conclusion that none of the four strategies adopted was relevant for us at the moment. We will follow their progress with interest. We did decide to do a ring-around of recent lesson participants to try to get some idea of why they are not continuing – my thanks to Anita and Jeff for this. The survey was restricted to those who had attended the course in the last couple of years and shown some interest during the lessons. Unfortunately the results do not shed much light on the programme. Of the 36 who were rung, 8 were disconnected, 8 did not respond to a message that was left, 12 said they may/will return at some time in the future and 7 said they were not interested. There was no pattern in the reasons given for not continuing. Only two said it was too hard and only 1 reported having a bad experience.

We did make a big effort with the last lot of lessons so it is worth examine this group in more detail. 18 of the original 24 finished the course, 6 are playing on Tuesdays, 4 of these have tried other days and most of the others come from time to time on Wednesday night or Thursday. We only appear to have lost three or four of this group.

THE WAY FORWARD

- 1. Re-examine the lessons.
 - a. Do we continue with Wayne;
 - b. If so do we restructure to have a shorter, simpler course followed by an intermediate course six months later? I suggest Ken, Tony and Wayne be involved with this.
- 2. Re-examine supervised play.
 - a. Move lessons to Tuesday night;
 - b. Possible daytime session.
