Coffee Machine

A trial of having a coffee making machine was not a success and the machine has been returned. The reasons for not going through with its installation are twofold. When the machine became inoperable the response by the supplier did not encourage the Club's retention of that facility. Secondly, when members were solicited to look after keeping the machine in a clean, working order the response was rather lacking.

On that basis, and from the general reaction of members when it appeared, Committee took the decision to dispense with its services.

Clubhouse Maintenance

Maintenance of the Club's premises is becoming an issue that needs to be considered in the very near future. Several ideas have been floated in committee meetings for items to be addressed but before the staging of specific tasks can be considered an programme of overall works has to be determined.

Items on that programme include but need not be limited to the following:

- replacement of the double doors at the entry to the main hall;
- reglazing the main hall windows;
- removal of the existing awning and its replacement with a structure not prone to being damaged when parking; and
- repainting the entrance foyer and the main hall.

Fence Repair

Repair of the fence damaged during the recent storms has been looked at but expenditure on that item will not be beneficial without removal of the tree stump right alongside the fence line. Its removal needs to be discussed with the neighbour and its resolution will require delicate negotiation.

Removal of the stump is clearly a responsibility of the neighbour. However, if their response is negative the Club may well be required to enter a financial agreement in order to effect the desired outcome.
